Breakfast and Rainbow After School Club


We are thrilled to see that so many families are now using this out of school hour's facility and that so many children talk very positively about their time there. We are so busy on some days that we have had to employ another member of staff! As you can imagine, due to this success, we are dealing with more paperwork and want to make sure we are very well organised and have efficient systems in place. With that in mind we would like to make the following changes:

- We would ask that places are booked in advance for both clubs if possible so that we are able to calculate appropriate staffing.
- We would ask that once a place is booked on any given day parents make sure their child attends. As we are allocating staffing based on booked places we will need to ask that you

make the payment even if your child is not able to attend as their place has been saved, this is in line with other equivalent services

- Payment is made in advance if possible for booked sessions or made promptly the week following receipt of the monthly invoice to avoid any build-up of costs for you and the school
- If a place needs to be cancelled we would ask that we are given notice (ideally 48 hours) if possible and then will apply a credit for that session

These clubs are now a great asset to our school and we look forward to working with you to make sure they continue to support our families and our school.



As always the children had fabulous costumes. We had a great time today celebrating reading and reminding ourselves about the value of books and how we would never want to live in a world without them. Pictures have been shared through our Marvellous Me app so

hopefully you have had a chance to see the delight this day brought to our school.

On a final note, we would like to offer our thanks and gratitude to Steer & Booth for their financial commitments each year.
