Attendance

Attendance is a major contributing factor for children's happiness and success at school and one of the measures used by Ofsted to assess the standard of education. Generally we have had good attendance figures for a number of years, but last year saw a significant dip and we are keen to address this quickly. Much of this was caused by illness.

We appreciate that it can be tricky to make the decision about sending children into school and we are always willing to have a chat by phone at the start of the day if it is helpful. Obviously we do not want children to be attending if they cannot cope with the demands of the day, but very often children who feel a little under the weather can be settled and distracted in school and have an enjoyable and successful day. If children do not feel well and seem to be struggling with their health we will always give you a call and explain the situation.

All schools follow government guidance that outlines when children should and should not be in school, a link is provided here for you to access and help you make the right decision. https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/healthy-body/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/. We will continue to follow the same guidance of allowing 48 hours following a period of vomiting or diarrhoea before a child can return to school. Please telephone the school at the start of the day to let us know about any absence.

Leave of absence.

Parents and carers should avoid taking their children out of school during term time. Leave will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances, this is usually under unique circumstances or those out of your control, all other requests for leave will be marked as unauthorised absence. As a school we aim to work closely with you and always have the wellbeing of children at the heart of anything we do. Please take the time to talk to us if you have any questions. Please also note that no leave will be authorised for Year 2 pupils in the statutory assessment month of May.
