

Pupil Premium

Background

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM), this also includes pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as the Ever 6 FSM measure). Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However we are held accountable for how we have used the funding to support pupils and we are required to publish the information online.

Pupil Premium Spending 2018-2019

During the financial year 2018-2019 Newdigate C of E Infant School received a total of £5,280.

This along with other funding was used to support children in their academic and personal development. Through:

- Targeted intervention teaching
- Nurture group provision
- ELSA Support (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant)
- Access to extra-curricular enrichment activities

The impact of this spending is summarised below:

- End of key stage 1 assessments showed children working above National expectations for all subjects and levels.
- Younger children were supported in the EYFS to achieve individual targets that were set for them. They are on track to achieve a good level of development.
- Intervention tracking showed that are children making expected progress.
- Children participated in extra-curricular activities that developed their social skills and confidence with sports as well as developing their physical well-being and self-esteem.
- Attendance improved for the majority of the group.
- Children with special educational needs received personalised provision that helped them to develop their social and emotional skills.
