Our topic this half term is 'Back to Nature'. This is an outdoor and well-being focused topic with an emphasis on taking care of ourselves, others and our natural environment, including the school grounds. This will be a Science, Geography, Art based topic.

During the Autumn term, up to Christmas, the children will be learning the following skills:

<p data-bbox="203 362 1064 582"><i>We will be enjoying developing our maths skills by providing practical opportunities both in the inside and outside classroom through playing maths games, shape hunts, building models, experimenting with capacity and weight.</i></p> <ul data-bbox="253 643 1064 1241" style="list-style-type: none"> • recognising and ordering numbers 0-10 (extending to 20 if appropriate) • Counting on from different numbers • Counting backwards from different numbers • Counting objects 1:1 to 10 (extending to 20 if appropriate) • Recognising the coins 1p, 2p, 5p, • Naming common 2D shapes: triangle, square, rectangle, circle, • Describing 2D shapes: sides corners • Comparing length and weight using mathematical vocabulary • Creating and describe repeating patterns 	<p data-bbox="1131 362 1982 534"><i>The children will shortly be commencing with wordless books before reading books with words. We will be enjoying a rich array of books, re-telling and re-enacting familiar stories.</i></p> <ul data-bbox="1180 643 2029 1289" style="list-style-type: none"> • Create a rhyming string of 3 words • Say the initial sound of a word - "c for cat" • Segment the three sounds in a three letter word (spell 3 letter words) • Listen to stories • Retell stories in their own words • Sound out 3 letter words and then blend these sounds to say the word. (Read 3 letter words) • Begin to recognise some high frequency and tricky words on sight e.g. 'mum', 'the' • Write their own name, starting with a capital letter for the initial letter and the subsequent letters lower case • Recognise and write the letter graphemes a-z
