Place Value   We will be teaching your child how to:   • Count in steps of 2, 3, and 5 from 0, and in tens from any number, forward and backward   • Recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (tens, ones)   • Compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100   • Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words   • Use place value and number facts to solve problems   Addition and subtraction   We will be teaching your child how to:   • Solve problems with addition and subtraction   • Use a variety of mental and written methods   • Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently   • Add three one-digit numbers   • Recognise that addition of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and subtraction of one number from another cannot	We start this half-term by writing a summer holiday recount. We will then be using our 'back to nature' topic and outdoor learning as a stimulus for some non-fiction and poetry writing. We will read a variety of poems from famous poets such as Michael Rosen to inspire us to include humour, rhyme and similes in our poems. Each week we have a lesson where we focus on a specific aspect of spelling, punctuation and grammar. We will focus on spelling patterns and rules, how to use full stops, exclamation marks and questions marks correctly and also how to add suffixes to words. The children will also have opportunities to develop their spoken language through Drama and performance poetry.

## Newdigate's Values and Bee Rules

<u>Our value</u> this term is 'Love', followed by 'Peace' after half term. We will be learning about Mother Teresa as part of 'Love,' and Mahatma Gandhi when we look at the value of 'Peace.' ## Year 2 other information

- Children will need to arrive at 8:50am at the Year 2 classroom door and at 3:10pm the children will be dismissed on the stairs on the KS1 playground.
- Please remember to bring bookbags in each day as they will need to change their reading books and You Read to Me books as well as hand in and take-home homework.
- Homework in Year 2 consist of Spellings, 1 Maths piece and 1 English piece. The children have two weeks to complete their homework and the first homework will be set the week commencing 19<sup>th</sup> September. Children will come home with a homework folder and homework needs to be handed in, in this folder and will be replaced with the new homework. Children will have a separate spelling book to practise their spellings, and tests will be recorded in the back so you will be able to see their mark each week. Our homework hand in day will be every other Wednesday and our spelling test will be every Wednesday morning.
- Children need to provide their own pencil case which contains: pencils, a ruler, a glue stick and colouring pencils. Please keep the size of the pencil to a minimum, no larger than 30cm by 10cm as otherwise it makes it difficult to store them all!
- Our PE days will be a Tuesday and Friday. The children need to come to school in their PE kit on these days. Children should wear black joggers or shorts and trainers with either their Newdigate PE top or their polo and jumper. Fridays will be our 'Feel Good Friday' and will involve a rotation of Yoga, Additional RE, well-being lessons and MOLES. Therefore, children should bring wellies and they can bring additional clothing to prevent their PE kit becoming muddy. Our MOLE days will be the first 3 Fridays of the term (9<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> September).
