#### **Street Closure Details**

Diversions will be in place to enable drivers to bypass the town during the road closure.

Roads to be closed under the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 are North Street, West Street and Dorking High Street from Pump Corner to Moores Road.

The closure will also affect all tributary roads leading on to the High Street from e.g. Pump Corner to Moores Road, namely Mill Road, Ansell Road, Wathen Road, Old London Road, Lyons Court, Dene Street, Paper Mews and Moores Road.

West Street Closure: 11:30-6pm (from Junction Road)

High Street Closure: 10-8pm

South Street Closure: Parking Bays Suspended - Beginning:

12am - 2nd December to 8pm - 3rd December

To facilitate this event advance notification signs will be erected warning road users to expect potential delays and managed access for residents will be put in place by event stewards. We have communicated this already via an online and offline consultation.
